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Clutch: Cable vs. Hydraulic

The clutch pedal in our Porsches uses two different operating systems to disengage the engine from the transmission. Depending on the year and model,

most of the early cars used a cable. In later cars, starting with the 928 in '78, then the 944 in '84, then the 911



in '87, a hydraulic system replaced the cable. Both systems have their advantages and disadvantages.

The cable is simple, but is prone to wear and needs regular adjustments. The cable can fray or break, or the pins or

clevises can wear too far for adjusting, but generally are less expensive to repair. When the hydraulics fail, the cause can be harder to pinpoint since, now, besides wear, the slightest leak can let air into the system. Loss of fluid or air in the system will not let you operate the clutch.

The hydraulic system is more complex, but can handle the loads the heavier clutch pressure requires for the more powerful engines. Also, the hydraulic set up has the inherent ability to self adjust for wear. The only maintenance needed is flushing the fluid annually.

lars worth of late '90s-mid-2000s gear in storage right now. Contact me if you are in the market.



I've discovered many things over the years that were needed on my car because I was getting ready for, or cleaning up after, a DE. The result is that I know the wear items like clutch and braking system are maintained to 100 percent, and there are no little hidden problems lurking under the shiny exterior.

So Drivers Ed is an activity that requires very little in the way of equipment. It is also an activity that can be planned well in advance so it doesn't annoy your spouse. It is also populated almost entirely by the nicest people you'd ever want to meet. Any one of these people will gladly help you decide which trailer and tow rig you need for the next event.
