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
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MEETINGS:

I heard that the winning car managed to get umpety miles off course and yet --- Come on FRANK, you know you didn't mistake Gandy Bridge for Courteny Campbell Causeway. After the Rally, drinks were served in the Skyline Room at the Finellas County International Airport. Except for the small turnout, the event was a success.

I guess most of you have heard about Porsche's showing at LeMans on June 19. However, at the risk of boring some of you, here is a short rundown.

FORD managed to win this prestige road race after 3 years and more money than a lot of Ford Motor Company stockholders care to think about. Estimates go up to \$3-\$5 million. Bruce McLaren & Chris Amon drove a 7 liter GT40-Mk2 to the overall win, handily trouncing the Ferrari efforts. The winning Fora averaged 125.4 MrH, covering 3,009.5 miles. Second place was the Mk2 of Ken Miles and Denny Hulme. Third was Ronnie Bucknum and Dick Hutcherson, also in a Mk2 Ford. AND THEN----A PORSCHE CARRERA 6 driven by Chris Davis and Jo Siffert. Again the "Batmobile" trounced the Ferrari 2 liter contenders, as none of the three Dinos made the distance.

Here are some notes from a somewhat partial observer --FORD with 7 liters managed to beat the best Carrera 6 by a total of 164 miles on this high speed course. FORD started 13 cars, finished with 3. Ferrari started 10 and ended up with 2 and Porsche started with 7 and ended with 5. After all was said and done, the Fords at the end had averaged 7.3 MPH faster for the entire 24 hours. > On June 8, GERHARDT MITTER drove a PORSCHE CARRERA 8 to an overall victory and record in the first round of the EUROPEAN MOUNTAIN CHAMPIONSHIP. The "hill climb" was held on a 3.6 mile course at Berchtesgaden, Germany. Mitter, driving with his left leg in a cast, managed to beat the defending champion, LUDOVICO SCARFIOTTI (Dino Ferrari) by 5 seconds. Perhaps as most of you know, the development of the Carrera 6 was sparked by Messers Scarfiotti and Ferrari's performance last year in European hill climbs.

It appears that the 8 cylinder engine has a lasting fascination with Porsche, as this seems to be getting additional development. You know that a conservative firm like PORSCHE doesn't spend money on an engine unless it has a plan in mind.
