Third Florida Parade

The Third Florida Parade is fast approaching us. is scheduled for October 29 and 30 at the Statler Hilton in Ft. Lauderdale. For the benefit of the newer members, let me give a brief rundown of this event. The First Florida Parade was held in Vero Beach in October 1964 at the Driftwood Inn. The event attracted about 30 Porsche devotees from the event attracted about 30 Porsche devotees from the three Florida PCA Regions (Gold Coast, Central Florida and Suncoast). There were three events, a rally, an autocross and a Concours de Elegance. This first outing was met with such enthusiasm, that a second was planned, this time sponsored by the Suncoast Region. The Florida Parade for 1965 was held at the Coral Reef on St. Petersburg Beach in late October and attracted about 80 Porschers. This time there was an autocross, rally, Concours, and an old fashion "drag race". From the enjoyment these outings gave, the Third and present Parade was planned. It seems that this is to be a way of life for us Florida Porsche owners, and I'll be the last one to complain. to complain.

For this Third Parade, there will be 4 events an autocross, a gymkana, a rally and a Concours. Each event will be scored on a basis of the number of Each event will be scored on a basis of the number of cars entered at the Parade and not for individual cars in each event. There will be different classes where applicable. Entrants will compete within their classes in the individual categories as well as overall in the individual categories, and all entrants will have an opportunity to win the overall trophies.

In addition to the events there will be a cocktail party. As I understand it, this is to be compliments of Porsche Car Southeast. Also on the evening of the 29th, there will be a technical session which will be given by representatives of POAC. The word has reached me that BURT PROPP, NATIONAL PCA PRESIDENT, will attend the Parade.

By the way, be sure to bring a trailer to take home all of the goodies that various firms and manufacturers have donated. As of this date, a very incomplete list reads: Classic Car Products will donate several of their car care kits and will also have personnel on hand to help judge the Concours. Vilem B. Hahn and Lucas Electrical Services have donated driving lights; Car & Driver and Sports Car donated driving lights; Car & Driver and Sports Car Graphic have donated subscriptions; Auto Mat donated a set of floor mats; James Auto Specialties will have several pieces of assorted jewelry; Kendall Refining has given 8 cases of GT-l oil; Competition Press gave us five 1 year subscriptions; Road & Track donated a copy of the New Matadors; Porsche Car Southeast a free cocktail party and six merchandising awards; Sharpe & Co. has indicated they will be agreeable to donating awards, the nature of which will be announced. Firestone has indicated that they will donate five front-end alignments for Porsches and five road hazard lights. There is also a possibility of having a full set of Tires available as a prize, but this has not as yet been confirmed. Porsche Stuff Engineering will donate several patches and a pair of head rests. I'll have more on all of this in the next issue.
