## COUNCIL OF TAMPA BAY AUTOSPORTS CLUBS MEETS 1st THURS.OF EVERY MONTH 8 PM BILL GRANT FORD!

Dick Bishop attended this month's meeting. Here's wha'happened: Council has \$118.75 in the treasury. Club dues are \$5 per year per club. Club rosters are due, ours from '69 will do since it was made up after the last few new members joined. Council insurance expires 8 Feb and must be renewed by that date. Cost is \$1 per member of participating clubs...except such clubs as do not use Council insurance program, like PCA, since we have our own program. The autocross committee submitted the 1970 autocross rules, rather comprehensive, and were derived from various local clubs rules, SCCA, and Washington DC area council as well as other eastern sports car club autocross regulations. - CLASS SYSTEM

  1. The class system is based, so far as is possible, on the past performance of the particular make-model, with the attempt being to classify the car according to its potential performance.
- 2. All cars having a different engine or body than listed by the manufacturer for a particular make-model chassis shall be put in Class A.
- 3. Production Cars (SCCA) not included in (CTBAC) classes will be classified as they appear by the event O.D., Autocross Committee Tech.Inspector, or any Autocross Committee members present. All entrants may appeal their classification to the committee at their next scheduled meeting.
- Cars having certain modifications or combinations of modifications will be up-classed in accordance with the following rules:

A. Cars having THREE or MORE modification points will move up ONE CLASS.

B. Cars having SIX or MORE modification points will move up TWO CLASSES.

C. Cars having OVER SIX modification points will be moved up ONE CLASS for each THREE ADDITIONAL modification points. (9 points-3 classes; 12 points-4 classes; 15 points-5)

D. Two classes have been formed above the normal fastest sport car and sedan classes to accommodate highly modified and race prepared cars, etc. These, Class A-sport car and Class F-sedans, are the highest possible move up for each class.

MODIFICATIONS-POINT EVALUATION

1. THREE POINTS
A. Racing tires or casings, two or more.
B. Super chargers and turbo chargers.

Wheel width and track increase over SCCA limits.

3. ONE POINT
A. Wheel width and track over stock to legal SCCA limit.
B. Carb., size, make, model, number diff.
C. Cam Shaft (lift and duration altered).
D. Change in induction system.
E. Displacement change over SCCA legal (.0472 inches) over bore.
F. Removal of interior beyond SCCA for sport cars, FIA for sedans.

G. Compression Ratio Raised.

SPORT CLASSES CLASS A: Formula (all), Specials (all), Sport Racers (all).

- CLASS B: Cobra, Corvette Sting Ray (all), Griffith, Lotus Elan (all), Lotus Seven (all), Porsche 911 (all), Porsche Carrera (2 litre), Porsche GTS/904.
- CLASS C: AMF Sport Coupe (all), Chevrolet Camero Z-28, Datsun 2000 (all), Elva Courier 1600 and 1800, Ford Mustang Boss 302, Lotus 46 Europa and Lotus Elite, MG Midget 1275, MGB, MGB-GT, Mini Cooper 997-1071-1100 and 1275 (except 850), Pontiac Firebird 303, Porsche 912-Super 90-SC and Super, Porsche 1500-1600 Carrera, Shelby GT 500 and 350 1967 and before, Toyato 2000 GT, Triumph GT-6 plus 6, Triumph Spitefire MK III 1300, TVR (all).
- CLASS D: Alpha Duetto 1750, Austin Healey Sprite 948-1100, Daimler 250, Datsun 1600, Elva Courier 1500, Ferrari (all except sport racing), Fiat 124 Sport Spider, Fiat Abarth OT 1300/124 coupe, Fiat (all abarth), MG Midget 948-1100, MGC, MGC-GT, Saab Sonnett V-4 and 3 cyl., Sunbeam Tiger, Triumph 4-A4-250-5 and 6, Triumph Spitefire Mark I and II, XKE (all), Yenko Stinger.
- CLASS E: AC Bristol-ACE, Alpha (all other), Austin Healy (except sprite), Corvette Straight axle, Datsun 1500, Fiat (all) 850-1200 and 1500, Jaguar 120-140-150, Mercedes Benz (all SL models), MGA 1500-1600- and 1622, Morgan (all), Sabra, Sunbeam Alpine, TR 2-3-3A-3B, Volvo P-1800.

- 1. Protests may be entered only by the driver and/or owner/entrant of a vehicle entered in the event, and then only against a vehicle in the same class as the protestor, except where overall trophy is affected.
- 2. Protests, other than classification, must be submitted to the Event Chairman within thirty (30) minutes of the last timed run of the protestor's (and protested) class, must be in writing and must specify the infraction of the rules claimed.
- 3. The sponsoring club may demand a protest fee, the amount of and dispensation must be stated in the event's supplementary regulations.
- 4. The burden of proof of a rule infraction shall lie with the person protesting and any expense incurred shall fall to him or as otherwise agreed upon by the protest committee.

- 5. The protest committee consists of:
   a) Event Chairman, Official Director-OD (vote to break tie only)
   b) Technical Inspector from Club
   c) Technical Inspector from Committee
   d) No more than two (2) members of the Council Autocross Committee Board, provided they or their class are not in anyway affected by the protest ruling.
- 6. Protest Committee decisions may be appealed to the Autocross Committee.
