Since no dealer nearby has the 914/4, here is another reprint from the Maverick Region. Written by Roger Chaney of that Region. "There are a few 914's now available throughout the country and driver/performance/impression reports are starting to hit the presses.

"A few local PCAers have recently seen the two 914/4's which are in residence at Economy Cars of Dallas. Some of us were a little disappointed to see one of the cars out in the Economy parking lot instead of on the showroom floor, but we did a fair amount looking with flashlights..and later more looking at the other car on display at North Park Shopping Center. Impressions of the car were as follows:

"The 914 is a much better looking car than its photos indicate. The removable topa is lighter, stronger and fits better than Targa tops. Driver has more foot-room than in a 911 or 912. Four cyclinder, 1700cc, fuel injected VW engine much more accessible for maintenance than expected. Just about as much luggage space as in 911, if you don't remove top. (here he means with just two people in car I'm sure) Engine access door is about twice as large as it appears in photos. Big bumper inserts look very functional. Price is a grabber. (Those are the plus features)

"Headlights appear to have been designed by a committee of engineers from Disney studios and the descendants of Rube Goldberg. Several places show consturction was done by Karman and not Porsche Bodyworks. Top all but eliminates rear compartment storage. Anyone over 5'10" should order the car with an extended steering column to get clearance. Trim kit, vinyl rodl bar cover, chrome bumpers, doesn't do much for the car, especially for \$250 extra. Current base price probably won't last long. (Those are the minus features)

OK, other regions are doing it, and we've sort of done this by way of mouth at the meetings, but now we'll try it in the mag: We would like the members to participate in a section of the newsletter by advising the editor of the type service (good or bad) you are receiving on your Porsche. This should include the following information...Dealer or Repair shop, Type of Car, Type of service, your own rating for the quality of service performed. This is not meant to stimulate business or detract from a shop's service...this should only serve members hunting a particular type job to be done, or for some Porsche owners who aren't aware of the qualifications of the shops in the area, according to our members. (if I don't hear from Contemporary Cars in Orlando pertaining to my tach pretty soon, I may have something to print from the editor's desk.)
