FACTORY NEWS: The Porsche factory is apparently very interested in improving their position in the Cam-Am series next year as indicated by various power experiments going on in their secret laboratory deep in the black forest. They've been playing with a 4.9-liter version of the present 12-cylinder engine and have tacked a turbo-charger on the side of it. They've been looking for 700 screaming horsepower. Not satisfied with these labors, another group of engineers is working on a transplant...can a 6.9-liter Mercedes V-8 engine work in the body of a 917PA? It sounds a bit scary. Other stories are leaking out, such as the union of two flat-8s with a 16-cylinder, 600-700hp result and some Porsche engineers have even considered bringing the old 21-cylinder, 10.3-liter Auto-Union engine out of retirement. So many good articles have been written about Daytona...that I just can't bring my-self to write anything of my own. I would rather write firsthand, but since I didn't make it, well. Between the papers, Panorama, trade mags, sports info sheets, etc...well, grab one or two, read them..and be proud Porsche makes your auto, even if you don't get up to 120 mph on Howard Franklin more than once or twice a year, late at night...when no cops are around.

PORSCHE/AUDI teams will race in SCCA Nationals. Porsche's newest sports car, the 914 mid-engine roadster, will carry the Porsche/Audi banner in SCCA races this year with six cars raced by three teams. With stiff racing in C-Production, 914s will be racing in three geographical divisions to try to win the class championship next fall.

Arrangements have been made for three two-car teams. Joseph Hoppen, Porsche/Audi competition Manager said: "We have been in touch with individuals who have had long experience with Porsche racing and who we know will do their best to win for us." Heading the west coast team is Richie Ginther, a former grand prix driver who managed Porsche/Audi Can-Am 917 last year. Art Bunker, who has ten years of international Porsche racing behind him and who is currently a Porsche/Audi dealer in Overland Park, Kansas, will manage; in the Midwest. In the east...Porsche/Audi dealer from Jacksonville, Peter Gregg has been invited to manage a team. Peter is the national B-sedan winner and under 2-liter Trans-Am winner with Porsche last year.

The three teams are expected to get into action in April, meanwhile testing has been underway with a sole 914 on the west coast. In its first race, it finished second behind a Porsche 911 and set the fastest qualifying time in its second outing. Needless to say, the 125hp six-cylinder 914 is the version they are racing. An 85hp four is offered and races in E-Production Class.

SEBRING 1970--- Two of the most powerful and fastest Porsches ever built will carry the blue and white Porsche/Audi colors in the 20th annual Sebring 12-hour, March 21.

The entry of two 917's in the event by importer of Porsche Sports cars and Audi front wheel drive sedans is an international effort involving principals from four countries. Owned by Porsche Konstructionen, the Austrian Porsche importer, one of the 520hp cars will be driven by Vic Elford, England, and Kurt Ahrens, Germany. Hans Hermann, Germany, will be teamed with Rudi Linz, Austria, in the second car. Gerhard Strasser, Porsche Konstructionen's competition director, will manage the cars during the race.

The Wyer-Gulf (no-nox, with the horseshoes? really?) Porsches that enjoyed at 1-2 finish at Daytona are also entered in the Sebring event...while Porsche is looking for even harder competition from that Fiat owned company car, Ferrari. Remember, Ferrari won down there last year.
