

7. Concour school (hopefully in May)


- 8. Drivers school (we already have committments from Dave White (1978 GTU champ) and Dave Pannaccone to help)

Happy New Year to all of you. I am looking forward to serving you as your 1979 President.






ON THE GO

As I write this article it is four days before Christmas and I should be out doing my Christmas shopping, but the Profile must go on.


Looking back at the Frofiles of the past few years, the editors always said in their final issue that it had been quite an experience. As I sit here I can say it is quite an experience.







TECH TIPS

This is the first of a three part series on tires. January will consider tire care and service. February mounting, balancing and alignment will be discussed. In March a size designation and fitment chart pertaining to Porsches will be published.

This series is reprinted in part from the PIRELLI TECHNICAL DATA BOOK.

PASSENGER TIRE CARE AND SERVICE

1) Pressure Recommendations

In order to realize all the advantages and benefits to be derived from Cinturato Radial Tires, rigid adherence to recommended inflation pressures is of paramount importance.

Underinflation can greatly shorten the life of a tire. It can cause irregular tire wear and possibly, internal tire damage or even destruction in extreme cases of excessive heat built up. In addition, it is well known that increased inflation pressure reduces rolling resistance and reduces fuel consumption. The cold inflation pressure recommendations contained in this book are for typical vechicle load and speed conditions.

When car is to be subjected to hard driving conditions, it is strongly recommended that cold inflation pressure be increased by 4 PSI.

Cold inflation pressures are those obtained after the car has been parked for several hours. At this time the temperature of the air inside the tire is equal to the temperature outside the tire (ambient temperature).

Pressure must be checked at least once a month and always prior to long distance trips.

Pressures must be checked when tires are cold because driving even for a short distance (one mile or 2-3 minutes) causes tires to heat up and air pressure to increase. In case it is necessary to check and to adjust the pressure when the tires are hot, the recommended air pressure as indicated in this book must be increased by 4 PSI.

For example:

Gauge reading of hot tire: 27 PSI
Recommended cold inflation pressure: 26 PSI
Desired gauge reading of hot tire 26+4 = 30 PSI
Therefore: add 3 PSI

Inflation pressures recommended in this book may not agree with those of the car manufacturer since, in most cases, these pressures were determined for conventional tires. However, proper inflation pressures are determined by the car to tire relationship and not by the car alone.

Since the normal configuration of radial tires differs from conventional tires in that they may look "soft" or "flat" even when properly inflated, it is essential that the inflation pressures be checked regularly with an accurate pressure gauge and not by appearance.

Never bleed air from hot tires because the tire would then be underinflated.

2) Tire Pairing

Bias

It is strongly recommended the Cinturato Radial Tires be mounted in sets of four and not be mixed with bias or bias belted tires. However, should this be necessary, tires of the same construction (radial, bias belted or bias) must be mounted on the same axle and radial tires must always be mounted on the rear axle. If radial tires are mixed on a vehicle, the type of tire occurring first in the following list must always be fitted to the Rear Axle:

Pirelli Cinturato P7	50 and lower Series
Pirelli Cinturato CN12, CN36	60 Series
Pirelli Cinturato CN36, CN73, CN12	70 Series
Pirelli Cinturato CN54, P3	70 Series
Pirelli Cinturato CN36, CN75, P76	78 Series
Pirelli Cinturato CN54, P3, CN75	80 Series
Pirelli Cinturato CN72	80 Series
Pirelli Cinturato 367	80 Series
Bias Belted	annual parases on this viol

It is necessary to follow this procedure because of the different slip angles between tires of different construction. The relationship between the slip angles of tires on a front axle and tires on a rear axle can cause an "understeer" or "oversteer" condition.

Understeer occurs when the front tires have a larger slip angle than the rear tires. The driver feels that the car is trying to travel in a straight line and he has to hold it into the turn or curve he wants to negotiate.

When the rear tires have a larger slip-angle than the fronts, the car is oversteering. That is, it tends to turn in a smaller radius than that negotiated by the driver. In such a condition, a curve appears to be too narrow and the driver has to compensate by steering out of it. An oversteer condition is particularly undesirable.

Since Pirelli radial tires have a slip angle smaller than that of any non radial tire, they must be mounted on the rear axle creating an understeering condition which is desirable if it is not excessive.

In any case, to realize all outstanding performance characteristics built into Pirelli Cinturatos, a set of four tires should be mounted.

CN75 and P76 Cinturato Tires for American cars have a maximum speed of 110 mph. The CN73 for American cars has a maximum speed of 105 mph and the snow tires for American cars 100 mph. Speed ratings for imported car tires are indicated in their size markings. However, top speeds should not be attempted unless tires are properly loaded and inflated and then for short periods of time such as that required to pass a line of vehicles. However, even with properly loaded and inflated tires driving at speeds exceeding 95 mph for prolonged periods can cause tire damage. Legal speed limits, or lower, if dictated by driving conditions should be observed.

3) Tire Inspection

Tires should be inspected periodically and always prior to long distance trips. The spare tire should not be neglected during inspections and pressure checks.

Tires showing bulges, cracks, cuts penetrations or uneven wear should be inspected carefully and replaced if necessary. Steps should also be taken to eliminate vehicle defects. In accordance with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards, Pirelli Cinturato tires have wear-bars in the tread grooves to indicate that only 2/32 of an inch or less of tread remains. At this point, tires must be replaced because they become illegal and potentially dangerous.

4) Overload

The maximum load rating of every tire is shown on the sidewall with the corresponding maximum air pressure. These limits must not be exceeded.

5) Driving Habits

Pirelli Cinturato Radial Tires are designed to provide maximum safety, handling and mileage. However, personal driving habits have considerable influence on overall tire performance so, whenever possible, care should be taken to avoid:

- a) Curbing and road hazards.
- b) Jack Rabbit starts and excessively hard braking.
- c) High speed cornering and zig-zagging.

6) Fuel Consumption

An improvement in gasoline mileage is normally experienced when changing over from conventional tires to radial tires, particularly at sustained high speeds. This is because radial tires have a lower rolling resistance and therefore generate less heat, reduce drag and utilize less engine power.

7) Winter Driving

Regular Cinturatos are quite effective on packed snow because of their flotation qualities and the fact that the tread grooves are kept open at all times by the rigidity of the belt. However, for heavy snow conditions, Cinturatos are available in a winter tread design with stud holes. Since Pirelli does not stud winter tires and is not responsible for their application, be sure proper instructions are followed. Only new tires should be studded. During the first 50 miles of driving on newly studded tires speeds of 50 mph must not be exceeded. During this time the studs will seat and anchor themselves in the rubber.

Snow tires should be inflated 4 PSI above the recommended pressure for regular tires but not over that indicated on the sidewall of the tire. The difference in pressure between front and rear axle should be maintained.

8) Oversizing

In the vast majority of cases, it is advisable to adhere to the recommended Cinturato sizes shown in the Fitment Charts. However, if oversizing is deemed desirable to increase load carrying capacities, improve traction or modify cornering characteristics, follow these rules:

- a) Make certain rims are correct width for larger tires.
- b) Use same inflation pressure as for recommended size.
- c) Check for sufficient body and chassis clearances under operating conditions.
- d) Be aware of effects on speedometer and odometer readings as well as gear ratios.


9) Speedometer Readings

When lower profile metric size radial tires replace conventional tires, the rolling radius of the wheel is often reduced. When this occurs, there will be a slight increase in the number of revolutions per mile and consequently a slightly higher speedometer reading. It is interesting to note that since Cinturatos have a constant rolling radius and number of revolutions per mile remains constant regardless of speed, load conditions or stage of tread wear. So speedometer and odometer readings are the most consistent possible.


