I hate to sound nagging but I'd like to see somemore orders for name tags. We can get three lines engraved for \$2.00 which is about a \$2.45 savings. They look like:





The January Board of Directors Meeting was held on January 9, 1979, at the Riverbrook Apartments Clubhouse. Dave Stoops presided. It was identified that the major moneymaker for the Region was Fireverksfest. 

TECH TIPS

MOUNTING RECOMMENDATIONS

Many tire problems such as vibration, shake, bead break etc. can be traced back to improper mounting. In order to avoid those problems, the following procedure should be followed:

A) Mounting Machine

Use only the mounting machines recommended for radial tires. Live pressure and compressor capacity must be considered when selecting and installing new equipment since insufficient air supply affects machine operation and may result in improper mounting.

B) Wheel Preparation

Before mounting the tire on the rim, all balance weights must be removed. Rims should be inspected for distortions, dents, cracks, rust and foreign matter. Bead seats and flanges must be clean and rust free.

Bent or distorted wheels must be measured for radial and lateral run-out. If excessive, it may cause vibration or shake particularly in the critical 50/60 mph and 80/90 mph speed ranges.

C) Tubes and Valves

Tube type Cinturato tires should be fitted with tubes bearing the same size marking as the tires themselves.

Pirelli tubes are specifically designed for radial tires and the use of other tubes may result in tube cracking and splitting. Conventional tubes are just not compatible with radial tires.

For very high performance cars with VR rated tires, be sure the tubes have special supersport safety valves. For every size and type (SR, HR, VR) check the tube code on the dimensional data chart for correct tubes.

Tube code: The tube code consists of a code number indicating the dimension of the cross section of the tube followed by a letter (A, B, C or S) and by the nominal rim diameter. Example -34 A 13.

Make certain the rim valve hole is the correct diameter to accept the valve without forcing or stretching.

When a valve is used in a large valve hole, a ferrule must be placed over the valve stem. Tubeless tires must only be mounted on wheels designed for tubeless tires, otherwise they require a tube. Never mount a tube type tire without a tube, even on wheels designed for tubeless tires. When new tubeless tires are mounted, new valves should be installed.

D) Lubrication

Lubricate both beads of the tire thoroughly. Also lubricate the inside surfaces of the rim flanges and bead ledge areas of the rim with liberal amounts of approved lubricant. Adequate lubrication is vitally important and this aspect of tire mounting cannot be over-emphasized. The sidewalls of a radial tire are more flexible and, therefore, may not force the tire beads correctly into position as readily as a conventional tire, without the assistance of ample lubrication. In addition, proper lubrication will prevent tearing and damage to the tire beads during the mounting process. With proper lubrication, tire beads will seat on the rim easily and in the correct position. This will insure a true tire profile and eliminate the possibility of stretched or distorted beads.

The basic requirements for a good lubricant are that it be developed from ingredients which will not react with rubber, be reasonably slippery, and fast drying. Low cost facsimilies or over-dilution of the lubricant should be avoided.

Under no circumstances should petroleum based liquids such as oil, gasoline, kerosene, or spirits be used as a tire lubricant. Water is not recommended for use as a tire lubricant.

E) Tire Fitting and Inflation

During the fitting or removal of the tire (manually or mechanically) be careful not to damage tire or tube.

For a correct tube fitting inflate slightly before inserting in the tire so that the tube is seated correctly without creases.

Check to see that valve works properly and then inflate. Be sure that no air remains between the tube and the tire. New valve stems, cores and caps should be installed with all new tubeless tire fitments. After careful lubrication, mount the tire on the rim, using the mounting machine in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

Inflate the tire using the following sequence:

a) Primary inflation

Remove the valve core and inflate the tire to 40 PSI. (An in-line pressure gauge with a flexible extension and clamp-on nozzle is highly recommended). This high initial pressure combined with adequate lubricant will ensure proper seating of the tire beads on the rim. CAUTION: DO NOT EXCEED 40 PSI AND BE SURE WHEEL IS

PROPERLY MOUNTED IN MACHINE ACCORDING TO MANUFACTURER'S INSTRUCTIONS.

b) Final inflation

Install the valve core and inflate the tire slowly to the recommended pressure. Check the valve for perfect sealing and install the valve cap.

Visually inspect the guide ribs of the tire. Note their position in relation to the periphery of the rim to ensure they are concentric. An eccentric guide rib indicates an improperly seated bead and requires the tire to be broken down and re-mounted.

Various types of bead expanders and inflation devices are available to assist expansion of the tire beads during mounting.

F) Installation of Wheel Assemblies

To avoid wheel distortion and to maintain a concentric assembly, snug the wheel nuts gradually at first and tighten to the recommended torque setting using the criss-cross tightening sequence. Wheel nut torque specifications are specified by the vehicle manufacturer.

Excessive torque on the wheel nuts can damage studs, distort wheel spiders, or warp brake rotors on cars equipped with disc brakes. A warped brake rotor can cause high speed vibration, or result in pulsating brake pedal action and reduced braking efficiency. It is recommended that wheel nuts, on cars equipped with disc brakes, be tightened to exact specifications with a torque wrench.

Assemble wheel covers and perform a final check of inflation pressures with the vehicle resting on the tires.


Wheel alignment and balancing are important for safety and maximum mileage from your tires.

Check how your tires are wearing at least once a month. If your tires show signs of irregular wear such as the inside shoulder of the tire wearing faster than the rest of the tread, your car may be out of alignment. This condition not only shortens the life of your tires but adversely affects the handling characteristics of your car which could be dangerous. If irregular wear is indicated, have your alignment check immediately.

G) Balance and Alignment

As with all radial tires, Cinturatos are extremely sensitive to improper balance and alignment because of the stiffness of the belt and its precise positioning relative to the mass of the tire.

Improper static balance can cause vertical motion or "bouncing" of the wheel. Improper dynamic balance can cause lateral motion or a "wobbling" effect. Both can affect steering and tire wear.



Excessive toe-in of front wheels can lead to uneven tread wear and less than optimum ride and handling.

It is therefore strongly recommended that the following services be performed when Cinturatos are mounted.

a) Toe-In or Toe-Out

Set toe-in as close as practical to the minimum value established by car manufacturer on both front and rear wheel drive cars. The purpose of toe-in in rear wheel drive cars is to offset the effect of camber preventing sideslippage and rolling resistance of the front tires which tend to rotate outward when in motion. Due to their lower rolling resistance, radial tires require less toe-in.

On front wheel drive cars the purpose of toe-out is to offset the rolling resistance of the front tires which tend to rotate inward when in motion. Also for front wheel drive cars set the toe-out as close as practical to the minimum value established by car manufacturer.

b) Caster

Set the caster angle to the maximum positive setting within car manufacturer's specification.

Positive caster places the axis of the knuckle pin ahead of the point of road contact producing a trailing effect which tends to keep the wheels tracking straight ahead. This is particularly necessary when the Cinturato radial tires are fitted on cars designed for non-radial tires. Due to the fact that radial tires have greater deflection than non-radial tires, the trail distance as intended by the vehicle design is reduced and as a consequence the effect of the caster angle is also reduced. By increasing caster, the correct trail distance is maintained and the handling characteristics of the car are retained.

c) Camber

Make certain that the camber is within car manufacturer's specification.

d) Mechanical Control

Check shock absorbers, wheel bearings, steering components and brakes to make certain they are in good condition and functioning properly.

e) Tire Rotation

Pirelli Cinturato radial tires should be rotated only when necessary at the first signs of irregular wear.

Rotate Pirelli Cinturato tires directly from front to rear and rear to front without criss-crossing. Front wheel drive cars require a regular non criss-crossing rotation for even tire wear. OBVIOUSLY TIRE ROTATION IS MEANINGLESS UNLESS THE CAUSE OF THE UNEVEN WEAR IS ELIMINATED. Once an uneven wear pattern is established by a wrong front end setting, the uneven wear pattern does not change. Rotation will only reduce the rate of wear.

f) Wheel Balancing

Balance all wheels statically and dynamically. There are two kinds of wheel imbalance: STATIC imbalance which causes vertical motion or "bouncing" of the wheel. DYNAMIC imbalance which produces lateral motion or "wobbling" effect. Imbalance must be corrected on both planes to produce a smooth, quiet running wheel. Balancing radial tires is no more difficult than balancing any other type, provided the tires are properly mounted.

Poor balancing is responsible for the majority of vibration complaints. Improper balancing can be costly in terms of dollars and man hours and is also damaging to the reputation of the tire dealer and the tire manufacturer, therefore, the best equipment should be used.

Wheel balancing equipment may be separated into four fundamental categories which are:

- a) Off-the car static balancers
- b) Off-the car dynamic balancers
- c) On-the car mechanical balancers
- d) On-the car electronic balancers

Off-the car dynamic balance does not include the imbalance effects of the vehicle brake and hub assembly but produces a very accurate balance of the tire and wheel assembly. Recommended for brand new, low mileage cars.

The on-the car electronic balance includes the effects of the brake and hub assembly and produces a very good balanced condition, especially in older, high mileage cars.

In March a size designation and fitment chart pertaining to Porsches will be published.



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
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Malibu Grand Prix
