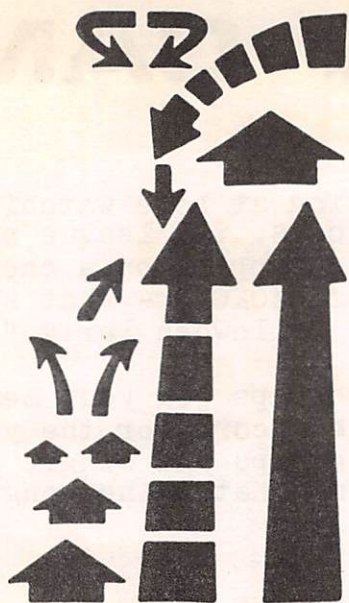

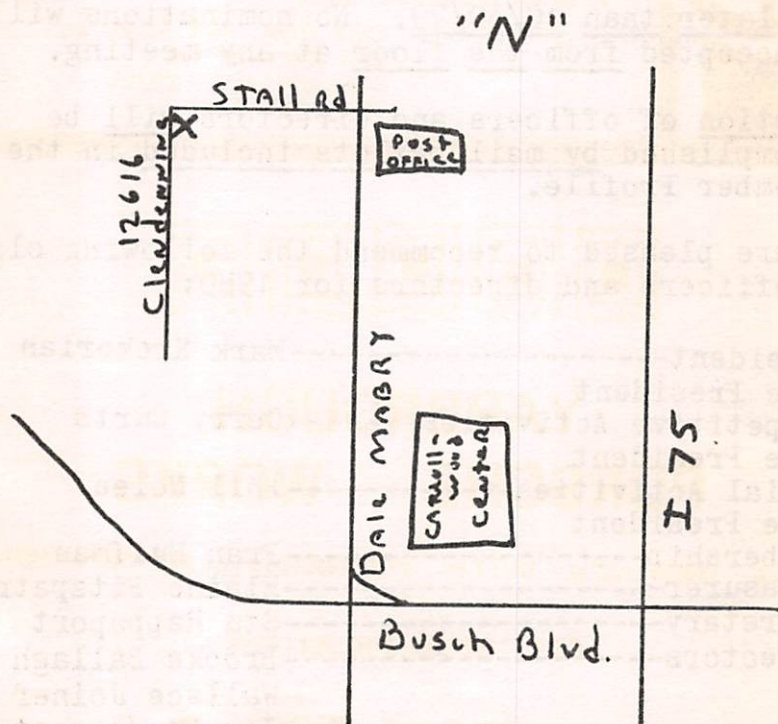
# Rock 'N' Roll

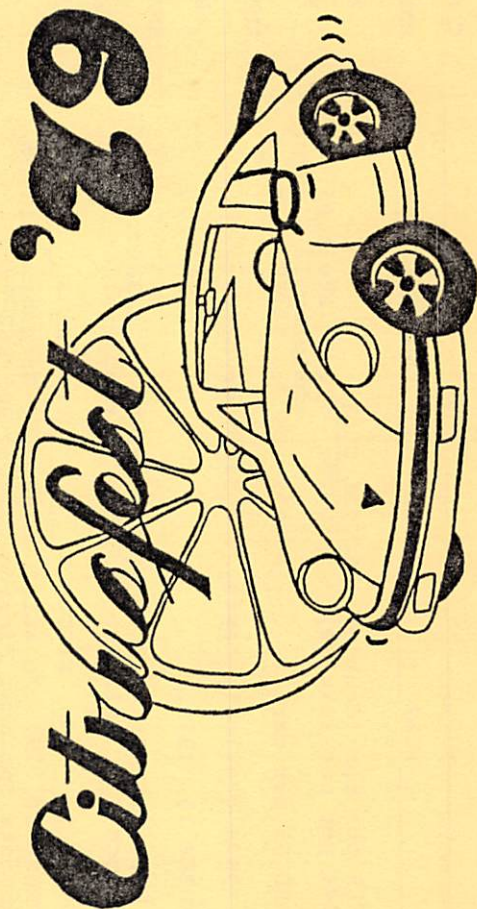

## Revision of By-Laws

The following revision of the By-Laws of the Region is proposed to provide a structure of administrative organization which is better able to meet the current needs of a much larger more dynamic Suncoast Region:

Article V, Section 1 of the By-Laws provides for the elected offices of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. It is recommended that this section be amended to provide for a Vice President - Competitive Activities, Vice President - Social Activities and Vice President - Membership.

Article VI, Section 2 provides for a two-year term of office for directors. It is recommended that this section be amended to provide for a one-year term of office for directors.

Article VII, Section 2 (e) provides that the Vice President serve as Chairman of the Activities Committee. It is recommended that this paragraph of Section 2 be amended as follows (as to duties).

1. Vice President - Competitive Activities - to appoint and to provide guidance to the Autocross Committee, Concours Committee and Rallye Committee and to plan, implement and steward the annual calender of competitive events.
2. Vice President - Social Activities - to provide for and co-ordinate monthly meeting activities and arrangements, social-only events (Christmas Party etc.) and the social portion of combined events (rallye/picnic, etc.).
3. Vice President Membership - to conduct and co-ordinate programs to obtain new members; identify and introduce new members; retain, on an active level, the current members of the Region; assist in the conduct of events specifically tailored to new or inactive members ("rookie" events, etc.).

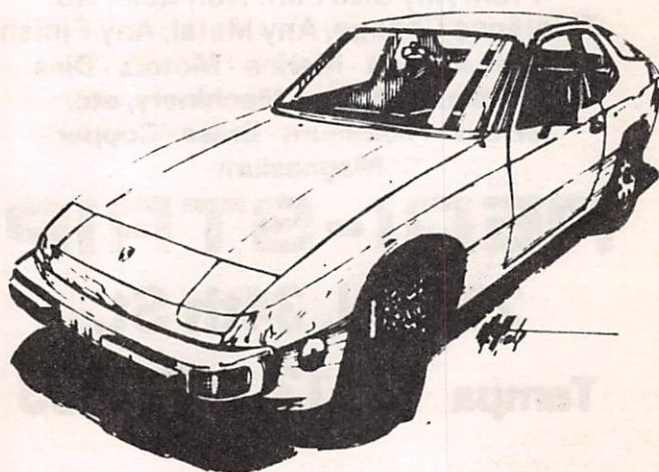

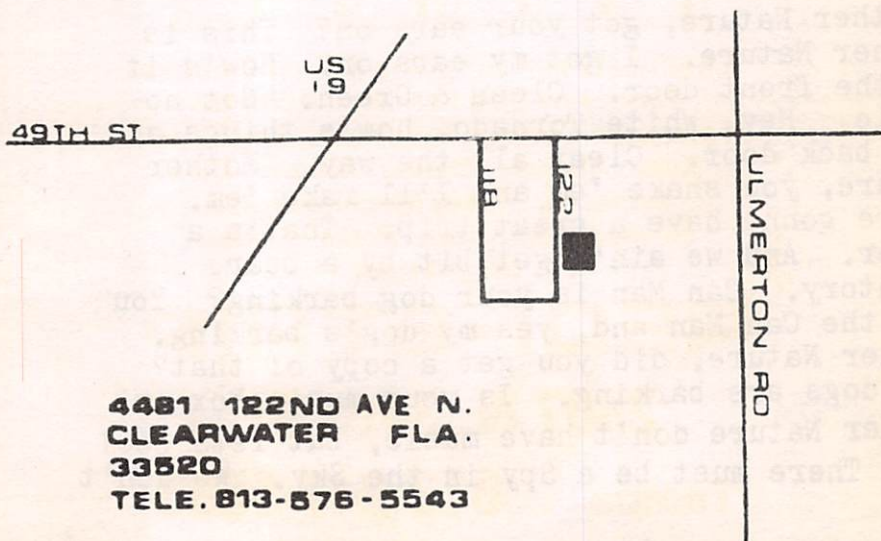

## AUTOCROSS - WORTHWHILE OR WASTE OF TIME?

I am not one of the people who take Autocross events seriously (all out to win). It is great fun, a bit scary, and definitely exciting. For those of you not familiar with an Autocross, a driver is timed as he drives through a course designated by pylons. I have always enjoyed the event as both participant and spectator, but considered the only purpose of participating in the event as being the FUN of it. I have recently realized the true purpose of Autocross (in addition to the excitement of the event). For those of you who are skeptics and critics of Autocross - you may become more accepting when you read further. Remember - Autocross is worthwhile; you can bet your life on it, and may have to someday.

I was driving in the right hand lane of an interstate on an overpass when the incident transpired. (Sounds melodramatic doesn't it?) An 18 wheeler (tractor trailer truck) decided to test the hypothesis that two vehicles could indeed occupy the same space at the same time. I originally was convinced that the driver wanted to run my car off the road over the bridge (but let's not be paranoid). Anyway, I realized that by his testing the hypothesis, I would be forced into the guard rail and over the bridge. My reaction was to make a run for it so I tested the acceleration of the 924. Had I taken the time to sound the horn (as the truck driver suggested later) I would definitely have hit the guard rail. The 924 accelerates well at 55 mph so I did not get hit on the entire driver side of the car. Impact was with the truck bumper and the left rear panel on the driver side. I did not immediately lose control of the car (myself yes), but I do not remember much after impact, other than when the car stopped across the left lane, about 100 yards down the highway after impact. I do recall doing a few 360's (fun on the autocross track, but not on a



busy interstate). The witnesses reported that it was incredible that I was able to maneuver the car out of the path of the truck and the other traffic. They did ask where I "learned to drive like that." Autocross was all I could think. Monetary damage to the car was relatively minor (according to the insurance company). Of course we know that any damage to a Porsche is very major to the owner. I guess my responses after impact were instinct based on practice during autocross.

Back to autocross - by driving in an autocross, you improve your reaction time ability, learn, how to control the car, and know what the car will do in certain situations. You practice tight fast maneuvers which become instinct when street driving (believe it or not).

For those of you who have never seen an Autocross or have not driven in one I ask you to consider it.
