SPRINGTHING '80

For those of us who journeyed northward to Asheville, North Carolina this past Memorial Day Weekend, the decision was tough. It was in direct conflict with Sonnenfest and there was that nagging feeling of letting down our nearby Region by not attending their event. The Smoky Mountain Region is in our Zone, however, and we took some solace in that we were supporting a Zone event.

Asheville is the largest city in western North Carolina. Excellent Porsche roads through the mountains as well as two interstate roads access the city from most any direction. As this is the location of the '81 Parade, we thought you might be interested. For those who like the long drive, it can be made in about 12 hours through Atlanta or about 4 hours north of Atlanta should you want to overnight in Atlanta.

Springthing '80 was, in fact, a trial run for the '81 Parade and as such, had its share of problems. If one considers the fact that the Smoky Mountain Region covers a large geographic area and members had to travel considerable distances to plan and organize the event, it went very well. In all, 16 Regions from throughout the U.S. were represented with approximately 90 cars registered.

It should be noted that as a Zone 3 event, the '81 Parade is in our Zone and the only Parade since the 60's to be held in Zone 3. Accordingly, the Parade Chairman, Mike Parker, is expecting Parade workers from the Suncoast. There will be more on this subject in the future for those of you who may wish to participate in working this National Event.

Ahhh, but how did Suncoast do at Springthing you ask? Well, it goes like this. After a blitzkrieg trip to Atlanta via Tallahassee (2-1/2 hour stop for business and refreshments at Tallahassee), Suncoasters Gerry & Judy Curts, Dean & Karlene Rowe and your editors arose Friday morning in Atlanta ready for the final leg to Asheville. Jumping off I-85 near the South Carolina border, we approached Asheville from the southwest (without the benefit of good maps) on some super switchback mountain roads. Our fearless leader, Gerry Curts, took us to the perimeter of Asheville where upon this, the editors, armed with a detailed travel brochure, proceeded to take the convoy 16 miles east of the city of Asheville. A pitstop at a convenience store and lots of

volunteers on the CB for "local information" did little to help as we did not know where in the hell we were! A turn-about with a side trip conducted by Gerry ended up, and I mean "up", a mountain road deadending in a schoolyard. Progress was now beginning to resemble a Monte Carlo Rally and was no doubt a harbinger of things to come. Once on the main road again and some simple instructions via CB from a local, we arrived in minutes at our destination, The Grove Park Inn and Country Club. As I mentioned, Springthing had its share of problems, not the least of which was that there were no Registrars available until 7:00 p.m.

The Grove Park Inn defies verbal description and no doubt some Suncoasters have visited here in the past and will understand what I mean. The Inn was built around 1910 and in the grand style of the era. An enormous central lobby is flanked by equally-enormous fire-places (the walk-in and look-up size). A rear terrace dining area (no bugs) has a stunning view of a swimming pool, terrace, tennis courts and a magnificent golf course, all falling away down the mountain. Among the guests were Tim Conway and Don Knotts who were making a movie locally and were to be seen often in the lobby or dining room.

After arrival, we met with other Suncoasters, Joe & Carol Pendergast & children, Bill & Penny Erler, Suncoasters now residing in north Georgia, and Marc Lawrence of Clearwater, with his brother who is a resident of Asheville.

Until this point, the editors have neglected to mention that their very willful 914, not wishing to make this trip, jumped off its jack stands several hours before scheduled departure and inflicted a serious kink in its left tierod rendering it temporarily crippled. Now the editors were not to be turned back by this despicable son-of-a-volkswagen and immediately brought up that oriental speed-demon, the Mazda GLC Sport, from reserve. However, the generous and persuasive Curts family thought their reserve vehicle, a 1978 Silver 928, might make for a better trip -- all things considered. After several seconds of debate, we caved in!

But, how did the Suncoast do, you ask? Well, registration revealed that the Concours event placed 924's and 928's in the same class. Some dalliance with the idea of entering the 928 after washing it in the rain was quickly put to bed--no competition. Not one 924 was entered into the Concours. Joe Pendergast was thoroughly put off by

the "three cars to make a class" rule for Concours as only one other racecar, a 908 like his, was registered. More about that later. Bill & Penny Erler entered their beautiful '73 Carrera RS and, needless to say, carried the day in the Early 911 Class with 1st place. Gerry & Judy Curts, not known for a burning interest in Concoursing, did not enter their 911SC. Dean & Karlene Rowe, driving a 924, like the editors, did not have a class to enter. Some good-humor pressure was put on the Concours Chairman who finally agreed that a Concours was, afterall, part car show and he deleted the three-car rule for racecars. The Saturday morning Concours was delayed by rain but finally came off. What the editors didn't know and what the homebound 914 apparently did know was that the Concours would have enough 914's entered to start a dealership. The Concours trophies were very clever. Nice line drawing caricatures of 356's under a downpour of rain but protected by the occupant's umbrella. All but one that is. The worst-prepared Concours car received the last place trophy, no umbrella--just rain straight down into an open car. The very appropriate name of this trophy was "Deutschland Schmutt" and it was awarded to our very own JOSEPH PENDERGAST. Not so bad you say, a 1st place and a last place in the Concours -- but wait, there's more.

A Saturday afternoon Rally in the sunshine with occassional rainshowers, mountain roads, picturesque farms, what could be better? Hitting yourself with a stick might have been better for some Suncoasters. The editors zipped along well for the first half stopping in the free zone about midpoint for a quick refreshment; seeing past National President, Mick Williams, & family doing same gave a very false sense of well being. Dean Rowe and Joe Pendergast, rallying together, did fairly well, probably placing 12th or 13th out of 43 cars, but that was the high spot for Suncoast Rallyers. The editors, after making what they thought was a devilishly-clever forced turn in a deadend road, became concerned after 5 miles and no clues. But wait, there ahead was the familiar blue 911SC of the Suncoast Competition Chairman and self-proclaimed Rally Champion, not to mention Fireverksfest Rally Master. We can't be wrong, press on! Question, why was the Competition Chairman, Rally Champion, etc.....etc., coming out of an "unpaved", "private road" between a church and a graveyard? Never mind that -- press on! Question, why is the Rally Master, etc.... taking both hands off the steering wheel and extending them upward? Ten miles - no clue, something is BAD WRONG. Could the Rally Master be wrong?
