On November 16th our annual Pig Roast will be held at Glen Cross's home. This is a beautiful location on the Alafia River in Gibsonton.


Last, but not least, our Christmas party will be held on December 21st at the Tampa Club.


Beach Party '91


The meeting was mercifully adjourned at 11:00 pm.
