Finally, Werksfest 1991 was our best event ever, and I want to thank everyone who made it a great success. Now into the Profile.





- * Picking through the sale items at Filene's Basement and buying a pair of Christian Dior slacks







The first topic of discussion was our new timing equipment. It is here, it works, it's slick- much thanks to Scott Tyler and Danny Stewart for their efforts. We will hold the timing equipment received from Big Cypress Region in the event they become active again.

The Pirelli Armstrong Tire Corp has inaugurated Pirelli Public Service Awards for PCA regions conducting community service/charity fund-raising events. For the calendar year 1991, Pirelli has thus far provided cash awards totalling \$3,000 to three PCA regions who most successfully fulfilled the goals of their goodwill events. We were Cochairmen of Werksfest in 1990, and I was registrar, and Jeri was in charge of T-shirts, at this past Werksfest. 




