he region presidents recently received the first significant wave of information from the Chairman of the National PCA Club Race Committee. Friedman, regarding the newly introduced PCA Club Racing Program. For those of you that are not familiar with this proposed racing program, the National PCA Board is attempting to install a racing program for Porsche cars only. This program is designed to provide a venue(s) for not only full fledged Porsche race cars, but Porsche cars of any year and model. The cars will require, at minimum, safety equipment consisting of roll bars (possibly cages), 2 1/2 lb. halon fire extinguishers, 5 or 6 point 3" competition harnesses, window nets and headrests, either integral with the seat or separate. It is anticipated that the program will kick-off with a race licensing school and a single race per region/zone in 1992. For a region or zone to put on one of these races takes a significant manpower and financial commitment. Obviously, a region or zone cannot commit to such an undertaking without a significant amount of support from their respective memberships. In order for your region's board to make an educated decision, we need to hear from you regarding your interest in participating in such a race program. Remember, racing takes more than cars and drivers, it also requires organizers, timers, scorers, communications, etc. I have asked your Profile Editor to print a questionnaire form in this edition to determine your interest. If you are sincerely interested, please take a few minutes to fill out this form and return it to me. If you have any additional questions please feel free to call me between 7:00 and 9:00 pm at

(813) 973-4249. We have much more to learn about this program,, and I will try to keep you informed as the program evolves.



For the more advanced drivers these lapping sessions are great because they afford the opportunity to gentlemanly pass anywhere on the track.

The last Zone 12 Autocross of the 1991 season is scheduled for Baseball City on November 17, 1991. I believe this event will be hosted by Citrus Region. Please support this event, Frank Goyco of Citrus Region is really putting forth an effort to create greater interest in autocrossing in his region.

Our November open Driver's Ed will be held on Sunday the 10th.

The instructor's day, which is an invitational event, will be held on Saturday the 9th of November. Some of our Level One drivers need to make the October 19th and November 10th driver's ed. in order to attempt to be advanced to Level Two and thereby become eligible for the December 14, 1991 driver's ed. on the 12 Hour Sebring Course. Because of the long straights and sweeping turns, the 12 Hour Course is really easier on your car than the short course you are accustomed to. Why? Because the long straights provide an opportunity for your brakes (as well as other components on the car) to cool, and it affords a few deep breaths for the driver. Further, keep

in mind that this event is still a Suncoast Driver's Ed., and will be conducted accordingly. As of this publication date, there are still openings available in all Levels (2-5) for the December 14th driver's ed.





PRESIDENT'S MEETING (Art Woodworth):







Proposed Change to the Bylaws of the Suncoast Region PCA:

This proposed change to the bylaws has been discussed and approved by the Board of Directors. In order to be implemented, it must be approved by two-thirds of the members voting.

The Articles and Sections to be changed are listed here with original version listed first and the changed listed second. Only the Articles and Sections listed here would be changed; all others will remain unchanged.

What this change does is make the Drivers Education Registrar a fourth elected Director with predesignated duties.

Article V Officers Section III

(Old) There shall be seven elected Directors. Three of the elected Directors shall be nominated for, and shall have predesignated duties as follows:

The first shall be principally responsible for the Region's competitive activities, the second shall be principally responsible for the Region's social activities, and the third shall be principally responsible for the Region's membership activities.

The term of office...

(Change) There shall be eight elected Directors. Four of the elected Directors shall be nominated for, and shall have predesignated duties as follows:

The first shall be principally responsible for the Region's competitive activities, the second shall be principally responsible for the Region's social activities, the third shall be principally responsible for the Region's membership activities, and the fourth shall be principally responsible for the Region's Drivers Education registration.

The term of office...

Article VII Duties

Section VIII

(O) (This is a new section)

(C) The Driver's Education Registrar is responsible for the coordination of level, worker and instructor assignments for all drivers; ensuring medical, registration and appropriate documentation is in accordance with event guidelines; collection of all fees associated with Driver's Education events; and overall coordination of event procedures.


members.





ROAD ATLANTA





A Road Atlanta Lap with Jeff Purner

Road Atlanta has a worldwide reputation as a true "driver's course," with one of the most challenging assortments of turns, elevations and high-speed straights to be found anywhere. While it's an extremely enjoyable track to drive, it's also very demanding. Concentration here is an absolute must!

As I cross the start-finish line, I'm well up into fourth gear, on the far left edge of the track. This line takes me directly to the braking point, just beyond the end of the pit lane. I'll touch the brakes, then squeeze on plenty of throttle as I enter Turn 1. If my arc through this right-hander— the fastest corner on the circuit— is correct, I'll be set for Turn 2 without moving the wheel at all. I'm at full throttle going up the hill on the left edge of the track and as I turn left into Turn 2 and the course flattens, I breathe off the gas. Turn 3 is a very hard right, so I get the car squared and balanced, then brake hard at the first white line, downshift to third, make the sharp cut into the turn at the second white line and get back on the power.

If I've done it just right, I'll have both right tires on the apex, squeezing on the power and then upshifting into fourth as I exit the sweeper (Turn 4), letting the car drift out no further than center track. Entering the Esses, I'm on the left side, moving up with full power to settle the car, clipping the last curb in each of the Esses.

At turn 5, I'll breathe off the gas early, brake in a straight line and downshift next to the curbing. My concentration here is on exit rather than entry speed, and I'll upshift into fourth as I crest the hill and head down the straightaway.


Moving full throttle in fourth gear to Turn 6, I'll take the car gradually to the far left, then brake hard at the first white apex and get back on the gas. The short stretch to Turn 7 is uphill and the car sticks very well here.


Turn 7 looks simple, but it's not. Many drivers make the mistake of going through this sharp right-hander too fast and lose time as well as exit speed. It's important to get the car set for this turn. As I approach on the far left, I get on the brakes, but I won't begin to turn or accelerate until the car is completely slowed and squared. Squeezing steadily on the gas, I take a late apex approach and use all the road for my exit. The rule "in slow, out fast" definitely applies here.

Turn 7 is so critical because it leads to the longest straight on the course. If I can get a jump here, I can gain extra speed and clip my time. Down the back straight, I go through the gears to fifth, staying to the left and moving right about halfway to Turn 10, a gentle right-hand sweeper. I move through 10 at top speed without lifting at all, on the far right, then moving slightly left halfway down the hill into the dip. As soon as I hit the bottom of the dip, I move quickly to the left, going up the hill- still under full power. I brake and downshift, then get on the gas to begin the next turn at the last white line.

I apex just after passing under the Nissan bridge in Turn 11, and keep plenty of power on as I descend the hill. Lifting off the throttle would be very risky on the downhill, so I'll keep a steady pedal all the way through Turn 12. This turn is difficult to master, and because it's also fast, it can be dangerous. I want to be sure to apex this turn in the middle of the second set of curbs. If I'm successful, I'll come out of it under full power, heading down the front straight once more.

Now I'm ready to do it again, only better this time!!


