As many of you know, I have been working hard to have our club adopt a set of Ralley GI's (General Instructions). In August the club voted to adopt these new GI's. GI's for those of you who do not know are a set of definitions for Ralley Masters and participants to use. Think of them as a Glossary for ralleys. These GI's will help create a Ralley environment free of confusion and arbitrary instructions often found in Ralley's that are put on by clubs that are not "Ralley" clubs.


The new GI's are a modified version of GI's that were utilized by a now defunct Ralley club for nearly 30 years. They are tried and proven. The modifications that were made were specifically done to make sure that our new GI's would address PCA rules and to make sure that definitions would not conflict with those published in previous, but very limited, Ralley GI's used at Parades and Zonefests in the past.

Novices might panic when seeing the length of the new GI's which is approx. 4 double sided pages. Don't! These are definitions and guidelines only. Many of the definitions will not apply during each Ralley. In fact these GI's are your friend and will help you determine the meaning of the Ralley instructions when confused. Like a dictionary, it is only needed for reference purposes. In addition these GI's will help Ralleymasters in writing their Ralley, and the check out team in checking it out. It will also mean that the definition for a "right turn" in one Ralley will be the same in the next. This does not mean that all ralleys will follow these GI's. Some Ralleymasters might have something unique planned. In these cases the Ralleymaster will provide one time only GI's or let you know what does not apply or is changed; otherwise the ralleymasters should follow these GI's.

The Suncoast Region of PCA new Ralley GI's are currently posted on our website on the Internet. This is due to the much appreciated efforts of Bob Stia who worked with me on getting the GI's ironed out and in alphabetical order. He also is responsible for getting them on the web page. Regrettably, there is currently a computer bug-a-boo that will not allow the GI's to be printed in their planned format. Bob is working diligently with our Web guy to get this worked out. Once this has been worked out, I request all members to download and print these GI's and to keep them for all future ralley's. We can save the club a good deal of money if these do not have to be handed out to each car at each ralley.

I am currently hoping to have a minimum of four ralleys a year. The first will be in the early part of 2002, so stay tuned for further details. This upcoming ralley will be a competitive "fun ralley" that anyone should be able to do. Its goal will be to show participants how fun ralleying can be and to provide an opportunity to drive our Porsches in the boonies on roads similar to the Fantasy of Flight drive. There will be a ralley school prior to the ralley. I can not do all of this alone. I need the participation from the club. First, I need you to attend the ralleys that are written if we are going to get ralleys back in our club. Second, I need volunteer ralleymasters (I will help you if you have never done this before) as I can not write all the ralleys myself. I look forward to your participation and your support. I think you will find ralleying to be an enjoyable way to enjoy your Porsche. So stay tuned.



If it's Wednesday it must be Stuttgart



We would land in Dusseldorf and take the long cut to Stuttgart through Czech Republic and Austria. On our return from the Czech Republic we had to make a stop in Nurnburg to swap out our rental car. I seems that the Czech's are quite adept at acquiring nice automobiles with no money down. Unfortunately they don't ask the owners if the car's for sale. With this in mind, the rental car company would not let us take a nicer car to that area. We had reserved an Audi nearly 6 months ahead of our trip. Of course it came with the disclaimer of "or similar". The car that we had been driving was a nearly new 5 speed Toyota Advantis station wagon. Now this car is equivalent in size to the Camry (and looks suspiciously like the next generation Camry.) The car was actually quite comfortable, but lacked personality. (Like a good librarian, it did its job adequately while generating little to no excitement.) Even so, we often traveled the Autobahn with the throttle buried at 220-225 kmph. Now I'm not going to do the math for you, but according to one of my car's speedo's that's about 140mph. Not bad for a 4 banger Toyota wagon! Despite this, I was still excited to be rid of the wagon as our trip was taking us towards the Alps and curvy roads. Upon arrival at the rental agency, I was handed keys to an Opel-something or other. Immediately disappointed, I figured that this Opel would be the car that the Cadillac Catera is based on. After all, it's the only Opel that I know of that would fall under the "or similar" quotation in our contract. Imagine my surprise when I found out that the keys were for a Diesel mini van. Now I was already in an EXTREMELY fragile emotional state as this was Wed. Sept. 12th. Wavering between tears, rage, a little fear, and disbelief, I flipped out! I stormed back to the office and declared that there is no way I was taking the van. Of course in rental car world they consider this "similar". I said no it's not, it's not even a car. They said, "yes it is, it has four wheels." At that point I demanded the Toyota back. Judging by the looks of their faces. I must have been generating body language that I was not even aware of. I think they thought that this abnormally stressed American was about to come unhinged and wisely agreed to giving me the Toyota back. Of course, then they charged me more for it, but this is still in dispute. The events of the previous day Sept. 11th would weigh heavily on us through out the rest of the trip. Never the less, we did our best to proceed as planned, despite the feeling of guilt that would occasionally come over us when ever we would start enjoying ourselves.

On Saturday (just one day before the "International drive your 356 day" celebrating the birth of Ferry Porsche) we headed towards Gmund, the place where it all started. As usual, it was raining. In fact, it had been raining for nearly four weeks according to the locals. But as we approached Gmund, I guess the Porsche Gods looked favorably on us as the weather cleared up. This irony of the weather clearing up every time we would go to do "Porsche stuff" would prevail throughout the trip. We would stop at the small privately owned Porsche museum and see the old surprising small, but well kept Sawmill where Number One was conceived and built along with approx. 50 Gmund 356's. Unfortunately Mary vetoed my plan to partake in a strange custom for 356 lovers who visit this site. (For those of you who do not know this custom, I'll just say it involves walking behind the building.) Now we enjoyed our visit to this area thoroughly; however, a recent well written article by another member describes this area and our next destination Zell-em-see better then I could, so with that in mind, I'll move on to our route that would take us there.

This route was suggested to us by Jeffery Fellman of Perfect Motion. (Perfect Motion is a local 356 Restoration shop and parts store.) This route would take us along a road called the "Grossglockner High Alpine Road". As I understand it, this road is the highest paved road in Europe and literally takes you too the top of the Alps. With the weather holding for the time being we saw the most incredible views as we drove up this road. Mary got the biggest kick when a heard of sheep decided to cross the road bringing us to a stop. Unfortunately as we climbed higher and higher we started to get back into clouds. Our fantastic view became limited. When we reached the top we stopped to partake in a local snack and a beer. This stop would also provide me the first opportunity in about 20 years to play in snow. I don't mean a snow dusting, but about a foot of snow. The drive up this road was one of the highlights of our trip and I highly recommend it for anyone who is going to be in that area. But be prepared for a toll that's large enough to sting. As we headed back down towards Zell-em-see the weather slowly started to turn bad again. It held along enough to find the Porschhoff Hotel, the first hotel I have ever seen that has a private property sign and a do not enter sign. With little time or light left we were unable to further hunt down the Porsche Estate which is in this immediate area.

The following Tuesday we headed to Stuttgart for our scheduled factory tour the next day. I was truly excited about the tour and was nervously looking forward to it. We entered Stuttgart completely lost. However, this was nothing new, as this was situation normal when ever we entered the larger cities. In fact the stress caused by these city jaunts was probably the biggest problem that Mary & I faced during this trip. I'm sure a couple of better maps would have helped, but never the less, the one lesson that I learned from this car trip is to stay out of the big cities if possible. (Its not a driving issue, but a directional one.) Despite not having a clue, the Porsche Gods again smiled on us, as we stumbled into the factory without even trying. Continued next page.



However, my excitement was tempered by the knowledge that my bed and food was not at the factory. We then spent the next two hours trying to find our hotel. Finally as usual within the last few moments of sanity we found it. To add insult to injury, the hotel was actually (thanks to a great travel agent) only a 15 minute walk or 4 minute drive from the factory. The next morning I got up early. Yes you heard it right, "I got up early" as I wanted to make sure that nothing would go wrong. We walked from our hotel to the factory. As we got closer we could see the occasional 996 screaming from the factory's gate. Virgin Porsches leaving for their first drive! As we waited in the museum for our tour to begin I finally had my first in-person view of Number One. What a beauty! The car that started it all, the first car to carry the Porsche name, was truly and awesome sight. However, I do suspect that number one looks better now then when new. Beside number one was a rare American Roadster and beside that was the "old man's" (Professor Ferdinand's) personal 356 which he drove up to the day he died and then was used as a test bed and currently has over 400,000km on it. Other notable cars in the museum were the Porsche designed 1949 Cisitalia Grand Prix car, a 917, 906, 550, 356 Cab Police Car, and a custom 996 given to Ferry Porsche on his 80th B-day. The most interesting thing about this custom 996 where the tires which have Porsche emblems as tread. After bouncing around like a kid in a candy factory our names were called for the tour. Our tour guide was fantastic! Now I had heard that the tour was nothing special. I would have to disagree with this. Mary & I both thoroughly enjoyed the tour which included seeing the engine assembly lines for the Boxster, 996 Blown and 996 unblown. The new line for the Cayanne is behind a temporary wall still out of sight. We walked past the engine check out rooms, and cool down area, where an engine for a GT3 was sitting. Our guide showed us the new updated cam shafts, and pointed out numerous interesting features of the factory and engine assembly. We then moved (backwards due to other tours) through the main assembly line where the cars are mated with all significant components to the component assembly lines where the dash boards etc.. are assembled. We were not able to go to the interior section again because of the secrecy surrounding the Cayanne. The tour guide was very interesting and accommodating. His obvious support for us Americans during this time of horror was most appreciated. His reaction when Mary told him that we had a red 356 was positively delightful. Mary's reaction to my comment that she needed to work more hours so I could buy one of these new 996s was not so delightful. Mary became the teachers pet during the tour and was actually invited up on the line to see the answer to a question that she had asked earlier. Mary now has a bit of trivia information that I bet most 996 owners and Porsche enthusiates don't know. I think I know what she saw, but even I don't know exactly where. If you are nice to her, maybe she'll tell you. Sadly our tour came to an end. Back at the museum, I mulled around for a while trying to burn the images of the cars into my brain before we headed back to the hotel to pick up our Toyota. As we left, more 996s rocked out of the gate. The shift we saw had so far built 5 Boxsters and 56 996's. Approximately 10 996's left the line while we were in the factory. I would guess 75% or better were silver. As we walked to our hotel more 996's would fly past us, some being tested, and I suspect some owned by designers and engineers that appeared to be going to lunch. We both really had fun this day, and I was somewhat surprised that Mary enjoyed the tour nearly as much as I did. I definetly recommend this tour to all Porsche-files who find they have the opportunity, but don't just show up, you must have a reservation. We made ours five months ahead of time with the help of Bert Smith Porsche and still got our second choice. Look for next month's article on our trip titled "Nurburgring, the ultimate E ticket ride."


