2020 Porsche Macan GTS Announced

Macan GTS returns for 2020 model year with improved performance By Porsche Cars North America, Inc.

A tlanta, Georgia - Porsche completes the Macan series with a distinctly sporty model. The new Macan GTS launches with a powerful engine, performanceoriented chassis, characteristic design and enhanced equipment. The 2.9-liter twinturbo V6 engine delivers 375 hp (280 kW) – an increase of 15 hp compared with the predecessor model – and is combined with the newly adapted PDK dual-clutch transmission. The Macan GTS can accelerate from zero to 60 mph in 4.7 seconds, or to the same speed in 4.5 seconds with the optional Sport Chrono package, and on to a top track speed of 162 mph.

Among other things, the new Porsche compact SUV family has earned the abbreviation GTS, which stands for "Gran Turismo Sport", due to its outstanding driving dynamics. Adaptive air suspension, which is standard equipment on this model, can lower the chassis by 10 millimeters.

The new 2020 model year Macan GTS is expected to arrive at US dealerships in summer 2020. Pricing starts at \$71,300 excluding \$1,350 for delivery, processing and handling.



Festival of Lights

don't mean Hanukkah, tree lights, or Holiday lights, and I'm not Ltalking about Clark Griswold's home illuminating prowess.

Let's discuss some of your car's most important dashboard lights (aka idiot lights) and what happens when they light up like a Christmas tree!

Believe it or not, each and every one of those lights is designed to communicate something to the driver, who in many cases doesn't pay the needed attention. They are also explained in the owner's



CEL or Check Engine Light: When it blinks STOP THE CAR AND SWITCH OFF THE ENGINE

A blinking CEL means that there's a misfire detected and running the engine



could cause irreparable damage. If it's on solid, it's letting you know that there's an emissions issue with the car, but it is completely safe to drive. The car's onboard diagnostics is detecting something different from the norm. It could be (and usually is) something as simple as a loose or missing gas or oil cap, which allows for a vacuum leak.

TEMP light:

When it blinks, it's telling you that the car is low on coolant. Top it



off. You can use distilled water if it needs a quart or less. If it's more than a quart, use 50/50 premix of any coolant which contains no sulfates or silicates. It usually says on the label "safe for all cars."

But, more important is finding out why the light was blinking. Low-coolant-level means that coolant was been lost over time. It's leaking from somewhere, even if you can't see it on your garage floor. The two most probable causes are:

1. A bad coolant cap. Caps are wear items which should be replaced every 5-6 years. Look at yours (with the engine completely cold) and see if you can find a white residue around the base of the cap. That residue is dried-up coolant that has leaked. Go buy a new cap and install it.

2. Your coolant system is losing coolant when the car gets up to temp and the system builds up pressure and could be from a cracked reservoir (expansion tank), from a bad sealing water pump, a loose hose clamp, or a damaged radiator, among others. To pinpoint the leak, a pressure test may be required.

common: Please note that the warning light icons may

vary slightly from model year to model year.

BRAKE-WEAR light:

Each one of your eight brake pads has a sensor inserted into it. When the pad wears down

to that sensor, the sensor makes contact with the rotor and lights up the brake-wear light. It's letting you know that your brakes are wearing thin, but you should be able to drive several thousand miles (unless you're on the track). When this light comes on, it's time to replace pads and/or rotors.

RESERVE light:



This one is pretty obvious. You have about 50 miles before you run out of gas.

TPMS light:

Tire Pressure Monitoring System constantly checks your car's tire pressures and

lets you know when they are out of spec. Rectify the issue as soon as possible.

ALTERNATOR light:



This one indicates that the battery isn't charging properly. The battery alone (without the alternator charging it) cannot



run the car very long without discharging and shutting down. It can get you a few miles, so try to turn off any unnecessary accessories such as radio, A/C, interior lights, etc.



ABS light:

The Anti-lock Braking System light comes on when the computer detects

a malfunction. Your brakes will still stop the car but they won't have the anti-lock function. so beware.

A BUNCH OF LIGHTS ON all at once:

When you turn the ignition key on, before

engaging the starter, the computer turns on all of the warning lights so that you can



verify that they are working; but if a bunch of them come on all of the sudden while driving, most likely you've lost the polyribbed belt. This belt runs the secondary systems such as the A/C, the Alternator, the Water Pump, and the Power Steering pump.

So, if you lose the belt while driving, at least those warning lights will illuminate and the steering will get harder but you can still steer the car, the alternator will not charge the engine but the engine will still run, the A/C will not cool but you'll feel air (warmer) come out of the vents and more importantly the Water Pump will not run so the engine will quickly overheat.

If you are a few miles from your destination, you can probably get there but keep an eye on the temperature which can quickly start to climb since coolant is not flowing through the system.

The most unlikely scenario is that the engine has died completely due to an IMS failure or other internal failure and that is covered on another one of my tech articles.

THE WAY IT WAS

Date Line 1985

In August of 1985 a blast was issued to all the regions in Florida, Zone 12, to collect as many favorite recipes as possible to include in a "Zone 12" Cook Book. The recipes came pouring in from every region. Each region appointed a representative to collect the information, compile



them and send them to a member from North Florida region to sort, categorize for type of food and send to a printer with a goal of making copies and selling them at the 1986 Porsche Parade in Portland Maine. The result is a "VERY UNIQUE" recipe cookbook, called "Florida Fancy Feasts" with 172 pages and anywhere from one recipe to 5 recipes per page depending on complexity and cooking instructions. Betty Croker step back, as the result is everything from "Good' recipes and "Great' recipes to "Unbelievable" recipes. We still have a copy and use it when we want that Special Dish for Friends and company.



BULLETIN

A Zone 12 (All Florida) Cookbook is in the making. I know there are hundreds of those "very special" unique recipes. The Zone Chairman for the project is Barbara Carraway, President of the North Florida Region. The plan is to compile favorite recipes from each Florida Region and put it together in time for submital and sale at the '86 Porsche Parade in Portland, Maine. Many Regions have done this and the projects are very successful. Profits for the venture will be shared by all the Regions.




Off to a Great Start



The Return of the Sunrise to Sunset Rally



A Summer Visit to the Porsche Museum: **CELEBRATING 50 YEARS OF THE 914** by Jeremy Swiger, European Correspondent

Way back in June, before winter descended on Stuttgart, the Porsche Museum held a 5-week celebration of the 914. The exhibition kicked off on June

2nd with an invitation to all 914 owners to bring their cars for a show outside of the museum in Zuffenhausen. In contrast to the bare landscape and misty-gray gloom which dominates the region this time of year, the "Typisch Porsche Tag" as the press release called it was sunny and clear, made ever more vibrant by the sea of '70s Skittles' colored 914s covering the museum entrance and adjacent Zentrum parking lot.

Free entrance for the day to the museum made a great excuse to visit, as if an excuse was really needed, so we took the opportunity to see the "50 Jahre Porsche 914" exhibition.

My wife, Kate, had never been to the museum and although I have been several times, the cars on display are constantly changing as temporary exhibits come and go and other


cars are rotated in and out from the regular collection. The museum building is an exhibit in and of itself, a giant monolith seemingly floating above its lobby and the museum workshop beneath. A massive cantilever dominates the edge of the Porscheplatz traffic circle, facing the factory buildings on the opposite side.

Underneath the cantilever, mirrored ceiling panels reflect the movement on the ground. On

this fine early summer day, sling-back lawn chairs provided a respite from the heat of the sun, next to a couple of rows of classic 914s. Across the street, the Zentrum's service lot was full, with 914s of seemingly endless variety spilling out

around the edge of the Porscheplatz; vivid primary and secondary colors breaking the stark contrast of large sheets of glass against silver-clad panels vbuildings.

Each car, while a similar copy of the next, reflected the individual personality of its owner; some more than others. One particular example, painted a questionable shade of metallic fuchsia, was adorned with decals of its rally team members' names and nationalities. The names, Barbie and Ken, obviously reflected owners with a sense of humor.

Inside the museum, the exhibits start at the top of a long escalator. A natural pathway leads the visitor from the earliest Porsche cars up to the newest. There is a regular display of cars from the museum's collection which rotates on occasion, as cars are pulled for events and exhibits around the world. Most of the cars run and drive, and many












are legally registered. In addition, special exhibitions such as the 50-year celebration of the 914 occur throughout the year. In June, the 914s shared floor space with the concurrent 50th anniversary celebration of the Porsche 917 race cars. As such, a limited number of very special 914-based cars were displayed right near the end of the museum.

Among these, three stood out for their unique history, rarity, or just plain strange styling. The latter of these, a one-off car built for M/Y 1970 and based on a 914/6 chassis, was a French-designed, wedge-shaped hatchback made from fiberglass. Its styling resembled an orange creamsicle, resulting from a cross between a Ford Pinto and Citroën SM. Unmistakable as something only the French could design, it was dubbed the "Moray," retaining a stock engine and interior despite its completely unique exterior. While I offer a harsh opinion of the look, it was critically acclaimed at the Paris Auto Show, yet (un)surprisingly never went into production.

On display before the "Moray" was a version of the 914 of which only 2 were ever made. Called the 914S (or sometimes the 914/8), these two cars featured fixed roofs and power from the 908's 8-cylinder racing engine. Ferdinand Pičch took one of them, with nearly 300 horsepower, as a proofof-concept. The other car, shown on display in the museum, was slightly de-tuned to just under 260 horsepower, made road-legal and presented to Ferry Porsche for his 60th birthday. Apparently, Ferry really liked the car as he drove it extensively on the surrounding public roads.

In front of the 914S and behind the Moray sat a beautiful metallic blue 916. The 916 offered more power than the already-on-sale 914/6, provided by larger displacement engines, with beefed-up suspensions and fender flares borrowed from the 914/6 GT (to accept wider wheels). Sadly,



after 11 prototypes, the project was canceled and the car never went into production. Current prices reflect the rarity of the 916. According to Hemmings.com from February 2019, Brutus (arguably the most famous 916 for its association to the Piëch family) sold for \$1.08 million at the Artcurial Auction at Rétromobile 2019 in Paris.

Past the 914s and right before the down escalator, the 2018 Le Mans GTE-Pro class winning 911RSR dominated the finish, not only of Le Mans but of the tour through the museum. Painted in "Pink Pig" livery, the RSR screamed "look at me" to all who walked by. As impressive for the bugs and tar spots remaining from the race as for its huge rear wing and carbon fiber splitters and air ducts, it was a surprise ending to the tour through the museum.

To any fan of Porsche, it's always hard to leave The Porsche Museum, simply because it brings such a rich automotive history right to the fingertips of the average spectator. Once you step on the down escalator, you have to commit to the idea that you are stepping out of decades of automotive engineering greatness and back to reality... at least until the next visit. On this warm June day, our return to reality was momentarily broken by the 914s parked outside the entrance.

We reveled in the experience of seeing an automotive legacy on display which is at the same time both historical and cuttingedge. As we walked back around the Porscheplatz, away from little mid-engined classics and back to where we had parked, we passed by one of the factory gates behind which were a few rows of brandnew 992s and Boxsters ready to be shipped to eager new owners throughout the world. The legacy continues!

For days, the weather forecast had been for heavy rain arriving Saturday morning with a cold front to follow. There were many anxious moments for the folks from Suncoast Porsche as well as those planning to attend. But, just as a few years ago, the front swept through earlier than expected and by 10:00 a.m., arrival time, we only had to contend with soggy ground. As you can see from the photos, the sun came out and made it another glorious day in St. Armand's Circle Park.

While our dear friend, Margharita Komyati who organized this and other Suncoast Porsche events has retired, Ashlee Castle took up the baton and created this event with the usual great Suncoast hospitality. Thank you, Ashlee. Well done. Lunch was supplied by the nearby Rico's Pizzeria and Pasta House. There was more delicious food than most of us could eat. And, of course, there were dozens of our favorite Porsches and Porsche friends.

Our thanks to Suncoast Porsche for another great day.






There's nothing more exciting than to be in a Porsche caravan.





Edison and Ford Winter Estates, Ft. Myers

Right in our backyard is an historic site that has great significance—the winter residences of Thomas Edison and Henry Ford. Located beside the Coloosahatchee River, Edison paid \$2,750 for 13 acres in 1885. Population of Fort Myers at the time was 349 people. Construction on the buildings began soon after and Edison's winter home was completed the following year. Edison's friend Henry Ford bought adjacent property in 1916. Edison's second wife Mina deeded the property to Fort Myers and the city opened the estate to the public in 1947.

A group of twenty-eight Suncoasters visited the estates on a cold blustery day in mid-November. Our guide Claire did a great job of explaining all that happened at this site during the years it was occupied by the Edison and Ford families.

After a thorough tour, we retired to the nearby Pinchers restaurant for a very social lunch.

It was a very educational and enjoyable day during which we met the Morgansterns who had just joined Suncoast PCA and live just blocks away from the estate. They have a Carrera S Cab. and moved there from Massachusetts.













TIRE RACK STREET SURVIVAL

This Is Not Driver's Ed... This Is Tire Rack Street Survival

Tire Rack Street Survival (TRSS) is a teen driving program with schools all over the country hosted through the volunteer efforts of members of the PCA, BMW CCA, SCCA, Audi Club of North America, as well as other automotive enthusiast clubs. Currently over 100 schools are held annually across the United States.

Suncoast PCA began hosting TRSS on the skid pad area outside of Turn 17 at Sebring approximately 7 years ago and has held one school every year with an average attendance of approximately 35 students. Students enjoy a full day of driving activities, classroom sessions, and demonstrations. The students also get to drive their car on a parade lap around the 3.7-mile Sebring racetrack during lunch. The 20-plus volunteer driver coaches come from the autocross and HPDE ranks and are led by the true heroes of the Suncoast PCA TRSS program: Bill Rowell (TRSS Classroom Instructor), Danny Shields (TRSS Chief Instructor), Brian West (TRSS Instructor Coordinator), David Herndon, and Bill Sumansky.

The typical TRSS day is a mixture of classroom and in-car exercises. The students spend a total of about two hours in two different classroom sessions. The rest of the time is spent doing in-car exercises in their car with a hands-on driving coach. The purpose of the in-car exercises is to teach the teens to control their car in unpredictable



situations while learning the handling limits of their car. The in-car exercises are based on real world scenarios while driving their own car. We strive to have the teens master the application of driving physics using their car. The teens learn to make good driving decisions and to react more quickly. They work on skid control on a wet skid pad; go through lane change/accident avoidance maneuvers; perform threshold breaking/ABS exercises; and drive a slalom course to learn about weight transfer. The teens learn to become more aware and learn how to begin



anticipating the actions of other drivers.

The classroom sessions cover a wide variety of topics including proper seating and hand positions, mirror placement, the concept of the contact patch of their tires, the theories of weight transfer, the use of longdistance vision, and situational awareness. We talk about the challenges of distractions to the driver, be it the radio, iPods, phones for talking or texting, or just the simple case of too many teens in the car.

We also have an 18-wheel semi-truck staged on site with cars parked around it to simulate highway driving. Each student and their parents get into the cab and close the door to demonstrate how little the driver can see and how many of the cars are not visible to the driver. This is a very eye-opening experience for all. At the end of the day, we have an air bag demonstration where we explode an air bag to reinforce what they learn in class about hand placement on the steering wheel.

We will be holding our next TRSS school on Saturday, February 22, to coincide with our first HPDE of the year. The TRSS schools are open to all fully licensed drivers age 16 to 21, using whatever car they normally drive so they will understand the handling





characteristics of the car they drive on a daily basis. While early registration is limited to the 16-to-21 age group, if space is available later in the registration process, we will open it up to over 21 as well. 


