## **Autocross 2025 Season**

Hello, Suncoast Region PCA members and fellow autocrossers. Since our last edition, we held our first event of 2025 on Sunday, January 19th, at the St Petersburg College Allstate Center. Although the weather forecast called for cool weather and rain showers for most of the day, we had a great turnout of 47 drivers! The rain held off until our lunch break, but that left the course a bit slick, so no one had a chance to improve their times during the afternoon runs. It was fun as always, and just like Drivers Education, rain really makes you work on your technique for smooth driving! Cory Corona with Arnage Motorsports sponsored our morning coffee and donuts, and he finally had an opportunity to join us for a full day of autocross after a few years of being too busy running a new motorsport performance shop in our area.

Overall run times were between 31 and 40 seconds, with the win going to a PCA member but driving a C8 Zo6. Alex H had the Fastest Time of the Day with a 31.281 sec run. 2nd place went to a BMWCCA member, Andrew S, in his powerful M2 at 31.287 secs. Bill S made the podium for Porsche in his 2013 Boxster S and came in 3rd overall with a 31.638.

We also had a great turnout of ladies! Ten women joined us in competitive driving for the January event. We want to encourage more ladies and rookies to join us to experience the great handling of your Porsche in a safe and fun environment.

The second event of 2025 was held at the Venice Airport Festival Grounds on Sunday, February 9th. We had a beautiful, warm, sunny day, and we appreciate everyone working in the hot sun for over an hour for each session at your workstations. The Festival Grounds incorporates the old WWII airstrip and access roads, so we are able to design a much longer course. This longer course is a lot of fun while driving, but it is a long work session when it's your turn to work. So, thank you all for staying until the end to ensure we have enough station workers to maintain a safe event - especially leading up to the Super Bowl that evening!

We had 41 drivers for the February event, which was an excellent turnout for Super Bowl Sunday. Bill S in the 2013 Boxster S took FTD with a rapid 43.948 sec run! The airport has a nice straightaway section that allows for some good speed - but you have to put on the brakes to prepare for a tight slalom at the end of the straight and a hairpin turnaround for the finish. David L, the 2024 overall champ, came in 2nd with a 44.211 in his 2017 Cayman S. And yours truly, Suncoast Region Autocross Chairpersons, came in 3rd and 4th overall - Kirsten with a 44.263 and Jerry with a 44.461. In his 2011 Cayman S, Tracy S rounded out the top 5 with a 44.510.

We are excited to pick up a new venue at Lead Foot City in Brooksville. We will host the first two events on February 23rd and March 23rd. We should be able to accommodate 50-60 drivers at this venue, so we expect many more PCA members to join us - no excuses for northern Tampa Bay members!! Also on the schedule are March 9th - SPC Allstate; April 6th - Venice; June 1st - SPC Allstate. Events are filling up fast, so sign up early at Clubregistration.net. 


## **Sebring History**

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

Good morning George,

Apologies for sending this a bit late. I have been working nonstop since the PCA swap show! I hope I'm not too late sending you this story, but I wanted to send it anyway. To start, the car itself. It's a 2007 Cayman S in Cobalt Blue metallic with black leather and a 6-speed manual. My family, growing up, always had station wagons, but my

grandfather was a Porsche guy, having owned a 1978 gray market 930 with upgraded turbos, an early 1997 Boxster, and a 955 Cayenne S later on. My Dad had always said he wanted a Porsche himself, but I had assumed that might be closer to when he retires. In 2007, I was in my first year of college in Boston, and I came back home for the weekend when my Dad said he would be in the city for work and could pick me up.

When walking back out to the parking lot, the sun had set, and in the middle of this parking lot, I saw a blue Cayman S under a street lamp and told my Dad, "Look, it's your dream car!" He had always said he loved Cobalt and wanted a Cayman S, so his ideal spec car sat there! I went up to take a look and was commenting on it, just circling it to look it over. I peered into the window and saw it was a manual, at which point I noticed he was holding the key in the reflection of the glass. I turned around and proceeded to lose my mind! Our family had always had Volvo and Saab wagons; this was a complete departure from anything we had ever had in the garage. We got in, and he drove off as I just took it all in, grinning ear to ear. Shortly into the drive, he pulled over and told me I was driving home. August 31, 2007, my first

drive in the Cayman. Over 17 years of ownership, I made many memories with the car, taking it to Porsche events road trips, and even leading some rallies I had organized up the coast of NH

and into Maine. I always looked forward to visiting home and borrowing a car to drive

> around; it became part of the family. Fast forward to November 25, 2024, and I was getting back into Tampa from a red eye out of California for work; after landing at 6 am needed some rest for a few hours before getting up for the day, but I woke up around noon to someone banging on my door? As I'm getting presentable, I hear the banging again and go to the door, only to see my Dad standing there. I had no idea he was coming down from Maine and was beyond confused about why

he was there. But he said he came to visit for a few days while I was home from work and that he got a fantastic rental from the airport and insisted on showing me blindfolded. I'm dazed from my work trip and lack of sleep, but I was very interested to see what he got. I was wondering if he got a Porsche rental

from National. He walks me down to the parking lot and tells me to take off the blindfold, and there it is... the Cayman S that our family affectionately nicknamed "Blue Thunder" (funny to us!).

After I stop laughing and ask why he drove 25 hours down from Maine for a visit, he stops and tells me he's giving it to me. After 17 years

and nearly 160,000 miles, he wanted me to have it instead of being traded in, and now it's my turn to enjoy the Cayman! I had a 1996 Mercedes SL500 I drove daily at home for many years, but sadly lost it in hurricane Helene while I was out of town for work in Texas and didn't think I'd ever end up with something I'd bond with like that SL, but this has wildly surpassed that benchmark.

I look forward to many years of memories with this car and plan to keep it as long as possible. Newer Cayman generations have been made faster and more capable than the first generation, but nothing will compare to the memories and design of that first-gen 987 in Cobalt Blue. 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## Freeze Your Road Grime

In this era of eco-friendliness where everyone wants to be green and help preserve and protect the planet, sometimes it seems that we can't.

I mean, how can you remove years and years of road grime on a Porsche's engine, tranny, and under carriage without using harsh chemicals such as degreasers, solvents, abrasives, acids, etc., etc.?

Well, I just ran into the coolest and most eco-friendliest way of doing this.

I went to visit a friend, who is the owner a local Porsche Shop in the area, and when I got there I saw something that made my heart skip a beat or two.

They had a Carrera GT (yes, the \$400,000 supercar from Porsche) on a lift and I could have sworn that they were sandblasting the \$20,000 CCCB (Carbon Ceramic Composite Brakes) rotors and calipers. I thought my friend had just lost it!

I quickly ran over to stop the madness, but as I got closer, I saw that what was coming out of the nozzle wasn't sand, but what looked like water vapor.

"Cool", I said to the owner, "using steam to clean the car?" "Nope", he said, "that's not steam, it's CO2 " (carbon dioxide).



I was immediately intrigued and started asking questions:

"So, what is it and how does it work?", "How do you generate CO2 under pressure?", "Will it peel off the caliper's paint?", "What other chemicals do you add to the CO2 in order to clean?", and a bunch of other ones.

He stopped what he was doing and started to explain:

"This is called Cryo Detailing and we're the first ones in the South East to apply the technology to automotive use. It has a very powerful, specially designed air compressor to blast away oil, grease, and stuck-on grime using only CO2".



"It is safe on paint, soft rubber, decals, etc." and he then showed me how safe it was by blasting the beautiful, Carrera Silver, left fender on the Carrera GT with his nozzle. I carefully inspected it, and it was perfect!

"We do not add anything else. It's just pressurized air and CO2". "Come with me, let me show you what's inside the machine". I followed him and we went to a giant blue plastic bin which as he opened it I could see that it was full of what looked like steaming rice. It was obviously rice-like CO2 pellets





As they were reloading the unit again with the pellets I took a handful (which almost burnt my hand from the intense cold) to photograph them, next to a penny to give you an idea of their size.



"The machine is fairly simple", he said, "it's a big air compressor which generates very dry, pressurized air, then uses the pressure and a venturi to add the CO2 pellets to the stream of compressed air through a hose. Before it reaches the end, we install the correct size-for-the-task mesh and nozzle for the particular job we're doing".

"So, depending on the air pressure, on the dry-ice particle size and on the nozzle's diameter and length we can do such delicate work as clean the white thread's stitching on a leather seat or we can strip off paint."

"Why dry ice?" I asked.

He answered: "The cold temperature, which can be brought down to 111 F below zero basically deep-freezes the grime which is then blasted away by the air pressure and the small dry ice pellets. That's why there's no residue other than the dirt we've just removed."

"So did you guys invent this or what?"

"No", he said, "this technology is actually used by Porsche and its dealers in Germany, as a standard service. We're just the first in the area to offer this service."

When I got back to my office I went online to check and I found this on Porsche's European Website:

Take a look at this aluminum suspension part which was scribed at the factory. You can see how well it cleaned, yet you can still see that the original aluminum surface was not altered (sandblasted) in any way.

This is really interesting technology, in particular for engine builders, car restorers and councour d'legance enthusiasts or just anyone who wants their Porsche as clean as possible, even in places that no one ever sees. And the best part – it's eco-friendly!

### Tim McGaughey:

Can you share with our readers and members about who you are and what inspired you to start this business and how has your vision evolved over time?

#### **Amy Riches:**

#### Tim:

### Amy:

Rallying the Porsches and knowing their capabilities, we started working with some other companies to develop and test some products to take the amazing Porsche product and step it up a notch so to speak. All of our focus was on the cars' handling and aerodynamics to make it faster for rallying, and that translates to track use as well. We were inspired to develop and co-create a lot



of aftermarket products for these cars.

#### Tim:

What are the key benefits that Porsche owners or fans can expect from your product or service?

#### Amy:

The biggest thing I would say is confidence and performance. Whether it's from the modifications that make the car handle battle on the road or the track which in turn instill confidence in the driver to allow them to become faster, or just the confidence gained from the work that we do on the cars.

With our technicians' extensive years of

experience and expertise, I have to give them full credit for the amazing job and attention that they give to these cars. You know, their standards are so high. They are very, very protective of these cars. They ensure that everything is looked at and thoroughly, gone through, or repaired and given back to the customer in tip-top condition. There is no question in the confidence that the car is gonna to perform as it should, whether it's normal driving or track driving.

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

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#### Tim:

How does your business reflect the values and heritage of the Porsche brand in your offerings?

There's not a thing wrong with the Porsches that are being produced, but it's always fun to tweak it. Just to give it just a little twist. You know there's nothing that gives us more satisfaction than when we see that grin on our customers face after we've done a little bit of work to the car they love and taken it to the next level.

#### Tim:

What future trends do you see impacting your business and how are you preparing for them?

#### Amy:

I think the biggest impact is the electrification of cars. If we're moving away from all of these petrol cars into electric cars and hybrids, that creates a big problem for an independent dealer like ourselves. A shop (like ours) does not have access or the capital to invest in what it takes to even work on an electric vehicle. The software and engineering that goes into electric cars is something that the dealership has very proprietary access to, which is understandable, but that sort of limitation I think is going to probably evolve us into what's known as a historic shop.

So yeah, we're gonna stick with these petrol cars and hopefully they'll be enough of them around for us to maintain our niche and passion for them.

#### Tim:

What role do Porsche events or motorsports play in your marketing or outreach efforts?

#### Amy:

The vast majority of our marketing is done through word of mouth. I like to engage with people and connect with customers at different motorsport events, and I do that all over the country. I attend track events in other Porsche regions and go to national Porsche events like Rennsport Reunion where I get a chance to really



present ourselves and some of the unique products that we have developed within the space that can help benefit Porsche owners involved in motorsport.

## Tim:

What has been the most rewarding experience for your business in partnering with Porsche or engaging with its fan base?

#### Amv:

Nothing becomes more rewarding to me personally than to be at an event where a customer whose car we've prepared, watching them grow from a novice driver to an advanced driver, or someone new to us - we've done modifications to their car - they get out of their car after a session on track with a massive smile on their face and a gleam in their eye because they were driving so well and going so fast. They often thank us endlessly for the work done on the car.

That is probably the greatest reward I can ask for and then have a customer recommend us to someone else. I had a call from California the other day. He said "yeah I talked to so-and-so and they said this is absolutely the only person you need to talk to. You need to talk to Amy at AutoQuest."
